



**Grammatica 1** gebruik van 'to go' in de -ing vorm ('present continuous')

Gebruik de -ing vorm als iets nu aan de gang is of voort duurt.

Where **are you** going? **I'm** going to ... (Paris, school ...)

Where **is he / she** going? **He / she is** going to ... (the tennisclub...)

Where **are they** going? **They are** going to ... (visit their aunt in Spain, ...)

What **are we** going to do? **We're** going to ... (play hockey, ...)

How are you going to travel? **We're** going ... (by train, ...)

**Grammatica 2** gebruik van 'by' en 'on' bij vervoermiddelen

Als je wilt vertellen hoe je gaat reizen, zeg je in het Nederlands 'met' (de auto) of 'per' (trein).

In het Engels gebruik je '**by**'. **Let op:** 'per voet' is '**on foot**'.

I'm going **by** car.

He's going **by** plane.

She's travelling **by** train.

In summer it is nice to go **by** boat.

In England you can travel **by** bike.

I like walking, so I go **on foot**.
